

MASONIC HISTORY/QUIZ

For what composition is Bro. Francis J. Bellamy famous? He was a member of Little Falls Masonic Lodge #181 in Upstate New York. Born in 1855, in Mt. Morris, NY and educated at Rochester University, Bellamy followed in his father's footsteps as a minister. He preached in Baptist churches in New York and Boston. Eventually he accepted a position as a writer and editor for a very popular family magazine called the Youth's Companion. In that capacity and with a fervent patriotic spirit, Bellamy promoted a national program to have a United States flag in every public school. This effort was so successful that in the year 1891, 25,000 schools acquired flags. Congress followed by passing a resolution to have a nation-wide flag ceremony held at all public schools on a special day. President Benjamin Harrison then endorsed the plan by declaring Columbus Day in October 1892, as a day to honor our nation's flag. However, there was a key element for the school children in this special flag program. During the time of flag raising, the children would salute with a hand held over their heart. Then, while in that position, the children would recite a patriotic verse. Bellamy asked President Harrison to write the words for this verse but that request was denied. Bellamy had to compose the children's flag ritual himself.

In 1955, the Little Falls Order of Eastern Star erected a tablet in Bellamy's home town of Oriskany, in New York, thus immortalizing Bellamy for his now famous school children's patriotic composition.
