



FROM THE SOUTH

A couple of weeks ago, I was privileged to attend a Warden's training seminar in Grand Rapids, and my eyes were opened to many aspects of masonry which we currently overlook. Some covered process and procedure topics focused on perfect world application and outcomes of some of the activities in which we currently engage. As we live in the real world, the reality of our current situation tends to be somewhere in the bell curve middle of that spectrum of optimal application and deployment of masonic principles. One message in particular that jumped out at me is the question "Am I my brother's keeper?". At occasional lodge meetings, the question is sometimes asked "Where is Brother Ray?", to which the answer is often replied "I dunno, it wasn't my turn to watch him!". All kidding around aside, the fact was pointed out that when strong bonds of friendship and brotherhood are shared and experienced, lodge activity of our members is much higher. The focal point then shifted to road blocks to the previous point, where family, time and health concerns get in the way of lodge activity. For the family and time conflicts, we can simply be supportive, understanding and willing to work with our brothers to the best those various situations will allow. However, some of our aging brothers, for health reasons, may not be comfortable driving at night, or may be on a fixed income where gas costs are a hardship on their attendance. In those cases, we need to mobilize our forces to identify brothers that could use a ride to lodge and work to provide those where possible! Granted, 95% of our brothers in that situation will be too proud to admit such in their lives and may make up other excuses as to why they will miss lodge. However, if we strive to deliver a strong program and strengthen the ties of brotherhood to where our brothers will make excuses to come (and NOT excuses to miss), we can lose ourselves in service to our brothers and provide some needed rides to lodge.
